

Fixing Divots

If you play golf, you create divots - it's part of the game. However, if you create divots, you should also repair them - that's part of the etiquette of the game. **Repairing your divots ensures that the golfers who follow you have the same level playing surface you had when you started your round.**

HOW TO REPLACE A DIVOT:

If your divot is in one piece, then it is best to replace it (fit it back into the ground the same way it came out, with the grass growing in the same direction). If it breaks into many pieces then use the sand/seed mixture located on the side of the carts, or on the tee blocks & on course in the black boxes. Fill the divot with the mixture and smooth it over with your foot so that it is the same height/flush with the existing grass.

If you're truly a steward of the game, you'll fix any divots you see while your partners are hitting.
