

Pace of Play

A good pace of play is an important element in having a **good experience** while golfing at Glenway. It's often a combination of little things not done that wind up contributing to slow play. Here are some tips for making sure your pace of play is as brisk as it should be:

- **Play Ready Golf**

- Honour is determined by the first player ready to hit.
 1. Let shorter hitters play first.
 2. After hitting, return to your clubs and prepare to proceed.
- All players are responsible for marking errant shots; play a provisional ball if in doubt. Players should all proceed directly to their own shots and then assist in searches after hitting.
- Park carts/clubs in the direction of the next tee.
- Always be ready to play.
 1. Plan your shot and select your club while others are hitting.
 2. Line up your putts before your turn.
 3. When it is possible, continue putting until the hole is complete.
- Mark your score card on the next tee.
- Implement equitable stroke control when experiencing difficulties.
- Every group is expected to keep up with the group ahead.
