

Power Carts

The wear-and-tear of golf car traffic can cause unsightly and expensive damage to the golf course. Tire ruts in soft, wet areas can take weeks to heal. Compaction caused by heavy traffic can also ruin the playing surface. **You can help prevent damage by following these rules:**

- For the benefit of course conditions, we recommend that cart paths be used wherever provided.
- Stakes and signs located at the approach to any green indicate the direction that carts must take. At this point carts must proceed to and remain on the cart path until player reaches the next tee. Power carts shall not be driven closer than 30 feet of any tee, green, bunker, nor any other areas where use of a power cart is prohibited by signs.
- On par 3 holes, at all times, carts must stay on the path provided, from tee to green. On #14 it is recommended that the cart remains on the cart path, unless the tee shot is wide left of the green. The golf cart must remain at least 30 ft. away from any bunker or green.
- Players who have health related issues that prevent them from getting around the golf course in a timely manner, can be issued a red flag that allows their golf cart to be parked within 30 ft. but not closer than 15 ft. from any bunker, green, or tee. All will be dealt with on an individual basis and must be discussed with the Head Golf Professional.
